

#### **Environmental Science Excursion**

The Year Nine/Ten Environmental Science class recently had the opportunity to go on an excursion to a Barramundi farm in Werribee. The farm is the largest farm in the world and taps into the thermal spring water beneath the Macedon Ranges to provide the fish with warm salty water. This allows them to grow the fish from egg to harvesting size, even though they are a tropical fish species. The excursion was beneficial for the students learning on sustainability, aquaponics and aquaculture.

Last week, the Year Seven/Eight Add-Venture students spent the night camping at Melville's Caves in Kooyoora State Park and had the opportunity to use a range of the school's expedition equipment.
